### THE RITE CORNER



#### THE RITE CORNER

Practicing Civility"

Several years ago, at the Conference of Grand Masters, I saw two presentations on a need and calling to restore civility to American culture and especially in the political arena. One in particular was an exercise in how to have a civil discussion on a topic that clearly had political emotions. There were six participants—two for the proposition, two against and two neutral. Some of the ground rules included the participants looking at the others

when speaking, not interrupting other speakers, and no use of labeling or demeaning comments. It was interesting to watch and at the end, even though some never changed their position, yet recognized some merit in the opposing view and some even admitted a weakening in their initial position.

The midterm elections are ten days behind us, with some rather offensive and even rancorous political advertisements blasting us relent-lessly on radio, television, newspaper and internet. We are now leaving that environment and heading into the season of Thanksgiving and Peace with Good Will to All. How do we turn off the vile switch and turn on the kindness switch? Some families have strict rules of not discussing politics at the holiday feasts. In Masonry we forbid political and religious discussions in lodge. The idea being that we meet as friends and brothers on the ideals that unite us and avoid the topics that divide us. This is a sound practice for in-lodge conduct, but the reality is our society has many challenges that need thoughtful discussion and dedicated search for resolution. Once a challenge is identified and proffered solutions advanced by a political party, that topic now becomes politicized and off-bounds for meaning problem solving because it is considered politically divisive.

Masonry teaches tolerance, loving kindness, patience and forbearance. Our challenge as Masons dedicated to these principles is how to engage in problem solving of topics that have become political hot potatoes? We can keep silent with our thoughts secret to ourselves or we can open up the discussion and hope to avoid being labeled as politically partisan. I think Masons have the behavioral discipline and intelligence to engage in civil discourse on tough subjects without getting into the political mud. If we are to experiment in civil conversations on hot button topics, here are some suggestions that will help sustain the civility:

- 1) Be steadfast in keeping the discussion civil at all times. Avoid labeling or prejudging others.
- 2) Maintain eye contract.
- 3) Be respectful of opinions contrary to your own. Remember that there is always a possibility that your opinion may have factual or logical flaws. If we are honest, we can all recall times when our opinions were not based on solid factual or logical grounds. Genuinely listen to others and try to understand fully their reasons. Don't just listen to look for weaknesses and to prepare your "rebuttal."
- 4) Use the discuss to learn and to share your ideas. Don't expect the others to capitulate and agree with you. Spend more time listening, than in talking persuasively. Recognize that we all have different backgrounds and experiences that shape our opinions. People who have experienced economic depressions and hardships from wars can have a different opinion on the cause and effects of economic failures and on the long-term impacts from war—personally and socially. Don't expect a consensus. It is okay to disagree and maintain differing viewpoints.
- 5) Most importantly, all times be kind.

This is not an exhaustive list, of course, but some thoughts on techniques to restore and maintain civility in public discourse to explore solutions to society's problems.

Enjoy the seasons of Thanksgiving and Loving Kindness and may you help spread these blessings to all you meet.


