Memorial Day weekend is approaching, and as we busy ourselves with family barbeques, graduations, and the busyness of life, take a few moments to reflect on the meaning of the day, and remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice in service to our nation. As a foreign born American citizen, many of the American holidays are unfamiliar to me, and Memorial Day is one of them. An excerpt from www.usmemorialday.org explains the history. "Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in service of the United States of America. Over two dozen cities and towns claim to be the birthplace of Memorial Day. While Waterloo N.Y. was officially declared the birthplace of Memorial Day by President Lyndon Johnson in May 1966, it's difficult to prove conclusively the origins of the day. Regardless of the exact date or location of its origins, one thing is clear – Memorial Day was borne out of the Civil War and a desire to honor our dead. It was officially proclaimed on 5 May 1868 by General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, in his General Order No. 11. "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land," he proclaimed. The date of Decoration Day, as he called it, was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle. On the first Decoration Day, General James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, and 5,000 participants decorated the graves of the 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried there. The first state to officially recognize the holiday was New York in 1873. By 1890 it was recognized by all the northern states. The South refused to acknowledge the day, honoring their dead on separate days until after World War I (when the holiday changed from honoring just those who died fighting in the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war).

This month, I am headed down to California, as part of the Scottish Rite Tough Mudder team, to participate in the event for the 4<sup>th</sup> year, and Brother Jason Smith will be joining the team this year. Due to the timing of the event, I will not be here for our June Stated Meeting, and Brother Sean McDuffee will be in charge.

For those who are members of York Rite, a reminder that Grand York Rite will be held in Billings at the Red Lion Hotel on June 1 and 2.

The event features a webcast of selected talent from Scottish Rite Masons from the Southern Jurisdiction. This year the Orient of Montana was proud when Ill. Brother Jeff

Bolstad was invited to deliver two cowboy poems that he authored. This is the first time the Orient of Montana has had the pleasure of having one of its members share talent for this event.

"Celebrating the Craft" originally was created as a fund-raising tool for the restoration of the House of the Temple, but over the years it has evolved into a reason for Valley members and their guests to get together to socially share Masonic brotherhood and friendship. Many Masons enjoy the friendship of their brothers and their brothers' families. These Masons notice that overtime their circle of friends includes many members of the Craft, with whom they have formed fraternal bounds. 


