THE RITE CORNER

"RiteCare: A Secret"

Within our Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction, in the Orient of Montana, one of the best kept secrets is the philanthropic work that our RiteCare programs provide to help children communicate. It is time to get that secret revealed to our Valleys and members that are not aware of these charitable services that are provided to hundreds of children in Montana and thousands of children in the Southern Jurisdiction of Scottish Rite.

Every two years our Supreme Council and its Scottish Rite Foundation of the Southern Jurisdiction sponsor a Conference that invites directors and clinicians of RiteCare clinics, board members of local RiteCare foundations, and all Scottish Rite members. This biennial conference provides both continuing education for clinicians and training to administrators, directors, and board members for managing and funding a successful RiteCare program and its supporting local foundations. On September 28-30, the 2022 Children's Language & Literacy Conference was hosted by the Scottish Rite Foundation of Missouri in St. Louis, Missouri. This Conference included representatives and members of the Northern Jurisdiction of Scottish Rite and clinicians and program directors of their Children's Dyslexia Centers. We had four participants from Montana RiteCare programs attend: Molly Beck, Director of Great Falls Valley Speech, and Language Clinic; Mary Beth Aasterud, Board member of Billings Language Foundation; and two private speech therapists associated with the Valley of Billings Language Clinic.

The common charitable goal of the Southern Jurisdiction and Northern Jurisdiction is to help children communicate, but the organization of their respective programs is different. In the Southern Jurisdiction's RiteCare Programs, the establishment and administration of the services are decentralized and done autonomously by Valleys, though some financial support is provided from Orient foundations and the Scottish Rite Foundation, Southern Jurisdiction. In contrast, the Children's Dyslexia Centers in the Northern Jurisdiction are established and administered centrally by the Supreme Council of the Northern Jurisdiction. Our RiteCare programs provide services to all impediments to speech and communication. The Children's Dyslexia Centers of Northern Jurisdiction target dyslexia specifically. Our RiteCare programs consist of four types: stand-alone clinics, facilities affiliated with universities, facilities affiliated with hospitals, and programs located in a Scottish Rite building. The Dyslexia Centers are uniformly in buildings under control of the Northern Jurisdiction. The reason for explaining this difference in administrative approaches between Southern and Northern Jurisdictions is that we in the Southern Jurisdiction see the challenge of branding of RiteCare with its diversification of names of clinics and differing structures for providing service. Our challenge is to make our RiteCare programs better known to the public as well as our own members. Stay tuned.

SCOTTISH RITE SPEECH and LANGUAGE CLINIC

The Clinic provided funding to send two clinicians, Nancy Rice and Kelly Melius, and board member Mary Beth Aasterud to the Rite Care Conference in St. Louis Sep. 29 and 30.

The board had a meeting with the Speech Pathologists on Oct 12. Mary Beth gave a report regarding fundraising such as grant writing, planned giving, giving funds through wills, fundraising dinners and donors via website. There was also a session on board leadership.

There were sessions for the speech pathologists. Dyslexia and literacy were discussed. Dyslexia is a learning disorder that involves difficulty reading due to problems identifying speech sounds and learning how they relate to letters and words (decoding). Also called a reading disability, dyslexia's a result of individual differences in areas of the brain that process language. Most children with dyslexia can succeed in school with tutoring or special education programs. Adults often find that they have dyslexia. Ten to twenty percent of the population have this problem. Many speech pathologists work with dyslexia. Our clinic will get more information on this and may provide funding for therapy to help dyslexic children.


